Whether defending Freud as the most influential thinker of the twentieth century, attacking the dreaded use of semicolons, reflecting on his own mortality, or even meditating on the nature of cats, *Sex, Opera, and Other Vital Matters* is an eclectic work that will appeal to any reader interested in the continuing relevance of ideas to life.
