research regarding how school-based occupational therapists (OTs) select assessments to evaluate school children in the school environment. Purpose: The purpose of this study was to identify the most commonly utilized assessments by school-based OTs, whether current, reliable, and valid assessments are used, and what factors influence assessment selection. A

survey was conducted to answer the three research questions: (1) Are therapists using current, reliable, and valid assessments, (2) what assessments are most frequently used in school-based OT, and (3) what factors influence assessment selection. Methods: Data was collected via electronic survey through SurveyMonkey during a three month period via AOTA website and through

Facebook. The survey consisted of 41 questions with a combination of open-ended and close-ended questions. The questions were quantitative (i.e. assessment type, frequency used) and qualitative (i.e. personal descriptions of why assessments are used, any factors influencing decision). A code-recode method was used to identify and confirm

<p>coding procedures and themes based on study questions. Conclusion: Based on survey results, 95% of school-based OTs are utilizing current, reliable, and valid assessments.
