The Washington Redskins franchise remains one of the most valuable in professional sports, in part because of its easily recognizable, popular, and profitable brand. And

yet “redskins” is a derogatory name for American Indians.

Prominent journalists, politicians, and former players have publicly spoken out against the use of Redskins as the name of the team. The number of grassroots campaigns to change the name has risen in recent years despite the current team owner’s assertion

that the team will never do so. The NFL, for its part, actively defends the name and supports it in court. The Washington Football Team are a professional football team that competes in the National Football League (NFL). Established in 1932 as the

Boston Braves, the team changed its name to the 'Redskins' the following year, and moved to Washington D.C. in 1937. In July 2020, following increasing pressure from fans and sponsors, the Washington Redskins announced that they would change their name, as the term 'Redskins' was seen as disrespectful toward Native Americans and other people of color. The team named itself the "Washington Football Team" until the announcement of an official new name at a

later date. The team won two NFL championships in the pre-Super Bowl era and has won the Super Bowl three times.
