Griffen provides historical context, personal perspective and a refreshing writing style to convey the conversations of others while his is having a conversation with you. Griffen is the Founder and Director of the Advanced Strategy Center in Scottsdale, Arizona, and splits his time between the desert of Arizona and the mountains of Park City, Utah.
