South Carolina Get Ready Grade 6 English Language Arts

In March of 2015 the state adopted the new South Carolina College and Career-Ready Standards. These standards define the knowledge and skills in English language arts and mathematics that children in kindergarten through grade 12 need to have to be college and career ready for the 21st century. The South Carolina High School Assessment Program consists of two tests - one in English language arts and one in mathematics - that are administered to public high school students in South Carolina under the requirements of state and federal laws. South Carolina law mandates that all public school students pass an exit examination as one requirement for receiving a high school diploma. Federal law mandates that states assess public high school students' academic achievement in

reading/language arts and mathematics.
