Patients revered their doctors as representatives of a sacred vocation. Do we still trust doctors with the same conviction? In *Trusting Doctors*, Jonathan Imber attributes the development of

patients' faith in doctors to the inspiration and influence of Protestant and Catholic clergymen during the nineteenth and early twentieth centuries.
