 Increased personal contact among people of all parts of the world has underscored the inadequacy of traditional language study to meet contemporary communications needs. Very real differences do exist between what is spoken and what is written in virtually every language. In Brazilian Portuguese, especially, the gulf between the two is wide: In many cases, the most cultured Brazilian is unable to comprehend with ease Brazilian literature

written only fifty years ago. A Língua Portuguesa no Brasil uma política de homogeneização lingüística analisa, dentro do referencial da Política Lingüística no Brasil, o tema específico da adequação das ações de política lingüística adotadas no país desde sua colonização até os tempos atuais. Although millions of slaves were forcibly transported from Africa to Brazil, the languages the slaves brought with them remain little known. Steven Byrd's study provides a comprehensive linguistic description of Calunga based on two years of interviews with speakers of the language. He examines its history and historical context as well as its linguistic context, its sociolinguistic profile, and its lexical and grammatical outlines.
