her, Everett, a wise and compassionate man and a pillar of the AA community, sues Dr. Miller, and their conflicting accounts play out in the psychiatrist's office and in the courtroom. At stake is Stephanie's recovery, Everett's reputation, and the doctor's career. What really happened? As memories form and evolve over time, nothing is exactly as it appears.
