Cravath, Swaine and Moore, as it is known today, one of the most prestigious law firms in the United States, was involved in some of the most important events in history. It was also a

Cravath in the 1890s, it developed the organizational model based on a large staff of associates, partners and clerical helpers that continues to dominate the modern urban law firm. Swaine [1886-1949], then a principal partner, drew heavily on the Cravath archives in the preparation of this work. The most extensive history of the firm, it is enhanced by Swaine's personal perspective. (He joined Cravath in 1910). The final volume lists biographical data for every associate and partner from 1899 to 1948.

Chiefly consists of documents and correspondence pertaining to Moore's effort to recover a number of mules taken from his plantation by Gen. E.E. Potter's army in Apr. 1865. Moore's letter (12 June 1865) to U.S. Gen. John P. Hatch in Charleston, S.C., states that: "Union troops under General Potter passed through my neighborhood [in Sumter District] ... they took from me 25 mules which I understand are now in the city ..." An application for

the restoration of the mules submitted by the law firm of Simons & Simons states that: "The mules were taken from the plantation of the applicant in the raid of Gen. Potter, in which almost his entire personal estate was destroyed." Also includes two drafts of freedmen labor contracts and affidavits from freedmen concerning the stolen mules. The letters also mention Moore's brother John B. Moore and his legal dispute with the Charleston firm of Cart & Kopff.
