It is promoted as an effective model for English-proficient students as well, appropriate not only for K-12 but also for early childhood education,

foreign language instruction, GED and adult English programs, and even two-way bilingual education. There are old-time patent medicines that made fewer claims. Is SIOP a truly miraculous pedagogy - good for whatever ails you? Or is it a classic example of "research-based" hype? "The Trouble with SIOP(r)" was inspired by a chorus of complaints from teachers, who are increasingly

required to apply the model by top-down directives.
