Known as an elite playmaker, his career total of 1,079 assists was the fifth highest total in NHL history at the time of his 2004 retirement. Oates then turned to coaching, serving as an assistant for the Tampa Bay Lightning and New

Jersey Devils prior to joining the Capitals as their head coach for the 2012-13 NHL season. As a college player, Oates was a standout forward for the RPI Engineers. He set single-season school records for assists and points and was named an East Coast Athletic Conference (ECAC) all-star and National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) All-American in both 1984 and 1985. He was named a tournament all-star in helping RPI win the 1985 national championship, and in

1990-91, the NHL included him in its Second All-Star Team; he played in five All-Star Games. Oates was inducted into the Hockey...
