This story is also about brotherhood by the mere fact that there were four sets of brothers on that team and how one set of brothers became the offensive and defensive anchors for that 1975 championship team. The defensive anchor was an undersized defensive lineman who was described by his

head coach as the smallest nose guard in the world at 5'6" 144 pounds and his brother was a 6'1" 212 pound devastating and powerful all-American running back.
