The Orange Bowl has been played 88 times since 1935.

Originating as the small Festival of Palms Bowl, meant to attract tourists to Miami, it has grown into a national football event watched by 16 million people. In 93 previous

seasons, the Wildcat football record was a miserable 299-510-40. The program had earned exactly one league title, that coming in 1934, well before Snyder was born. In the years just prior to Snyders arrival, the Wildcats had slumped to their worst, even by K-State standards. The program had lost 13 games in a row, and except for one tie, and had not rung the victory bell in

27 games. Seventeen years later, Snyder's orchestration of the greatest turnaround in college football history defines the American dream of achieving the unimaginable.
