He attended Harvard University and earned a Bachelor of Arts degree in Social Studies. After his previous band *Lock Up* disbanded, Morello met Zack de la Rocha and the two founded *Rage Against the*

Machine together. The group went on to become one of the most popular and influential rock acts of the 1990s. He is best known for his unique and creative guitar playing style, which incorporates feedback noise, unconventional picking and tapping as well as heavy use of guitar effects. Morello is also noted for his leftist political views and activism; his creation of his side project The

Nightwatchman offered an outlet for his views while playing mostly apolitical music with Audioslave. Tom Morello was born on May 30, 1964, in Harlem, New York, to Ngethe Njoroge and Mary Morello. Morello is of Irish and Italian descent on his maternal side, and Kikuyu Kenyan descent on his paternal side. His mother was a schoolteacher from Marseilles, Illinois, who...
