Circular Letter Requesting Donations for the American Anti-Slavery Society

Five letters of A.G. "Bige" Smith, a businessman from Globe, Arizona, traveling by railroad to California by way of Tucson and Phoenix. The earliest letter (typewritten, 1 p.), dated Feb. 15, 1908, is addressed to Smith from Edward J. Wilcox, the president of The Argentine Central Railway Company, on the letterhead stationery of the company. Wilcox is declining a request for financial assistance from Smith due to his own tight financial situation. Four of the letters, dated 1912-1913, are handwritten by Smith to his wife. They contain details of his business transactions and dealings in real estate and banking. Two of the letters are on the letterhead stationery of Smith's business partner in his ventures, J.S. Griffin, of Phoenix, Arizona. One is on the letterhead stationery of the "Hotel Adams" in Phoenix, Arizona.
