On October 12, 2004, on their home court in KeyArena, packed to the rafters with screaming fans, the Seattle Storm capped off a triumphant season with a championship title. It was the city's first major sports championship in 25 years, the third overall. In the days that followed, thousands of people paraded the streets, season ticket sales soared, and the city embraced new sports legends Lauren Jackson, Sue Bird, and Betty Lennox.

This groundbreaking resource covers a breadth of topics, including bone development, burnout, gender and racial stereotypes, injuries, motor behavior, and parental pressures. Written by Robin S. Vealey and Melissa A. Chase, the 16 chapters of *Best Practice for Youth Sport* are divided into four parts. Part I, *Youth Sport Basics*, provides readers with the fundamental knowledge and background related to the history, evolution, and organization of youth sport. Part II, *Maturation and Readiness for Youth Sport Participants*, is the core of understanding how and why youth sport is different from adult sport. This part details why it is important to know when youth are ready to learn and compete. Part III, *Intensity of Participation in Youth Sport*, examines the appropriateness of physical and psychological intensity at various developmental stages and the potential ramifications of overtraining, overspecialization, overstress, and overuse. The text concludes with part IV, *Social Considerations in Youth Sport*, which examines how youth sport coaches and parents can help

create a supportive social environment so that children can maximize the enjoyment and benefits from youth sport. In addition to 14 appendixes, activities, glossaries, study questions, and other resources that appear in *Best Practice for Youth Sport*, the textbook is enhanced with instructor ancillaries: a test package, image bank, and instructor guide that features a syllabus, additional study questions and learning activities, tips on teaching difficult concepts, and additional readings and resources.
