Take Charge of Your Future

This handbook is intended to present a clear pathway for general and special education teachers to adequately prepare for students with special needs who are struggling with the general education curriculum. All special education teachers, and any general education teachers who frequently have students on their roster who require more than incidental modifications of their curriculum, are the appropriate participants for training in the use of this process.
