Exact diagnosis on right iliac fossa pain is still difficult, especially in children, young females, older patients and during pregnancy. It is in these cases that the laparoscopic approach may be most beneficial, both in terms of diagnosis and surgery, whereas the open procedure is still the gold standard in patients with a clear diagnosis of appendicitis. However, laparoscopic surgery is at least as effective, although more expensive and complicated to perform. Furthermore, in terms of the wound infection rate, the laparoscopic method has proven to be more effective. This book is of interest for general and laparoscopic surgeons, as well as for emergency doctors, gastroenterologists, gynecologists and doctors with an interest in epidemiology.

Acute appendicitis is one of the most common surgical abdominal emergencies worldwide, with a lifetime risk of 8.6% for males and 6.7% for females. This compilation discusses how while non-operative treatment of appendicitis has been proposed as an alternative to surgery, appendectomy remains the mainstay of treatment in most cases and techniques have shifted from open to laparoscopic methods. The current knowledge in pathogenesis, diagnosis, and clinical management of acute appendicitis is also discussed. Next, the authors present an updated review chapter of appendicitis regarding its prevalence and risk factors, particularly how the diagnosis of appendicitis is based on a history of diffuse abdominal pain, which usually starts in the central region of the abdomen and migrates to the lower right quadrant of the abdomen. The residual remnant or stump of the appendix after an initial appendectomy may become inflamed causing what is commonly referred to as stump appendicitis. Treatment with antibiotics may be attempted as an alternative to surgery; however, the vast majority of cases require definitive surgical excision of the remnant appendix. The authors propose that keeping this disease in the differential is important in reducing complications associated with delayed diagnosis.

"Perforated appendicitis occurs in a third of all pediatric patients admitted for appendicitis. Patients with perforated appendicitis have increased length of stay and readmission rates due to complications, including infection. The purpose of this evidence-based practice project was to increase knowledge about a change in the antibiotics used at the targeted institution, and implementation of an updated treatment protocol for patients admitted with perforated appendicitis. A prequestionnaire and postquestionnaire were used to determine the change in knowledge among surgical providers and nursing staff. After the completion of education sessions, the updated treatment protocol, which included the use of ceftriaxone and metronidazole, was implemented. The rate of provider compliance with the updated protocol, along with patient outcomes, was measured. Forty-two participants completed the prequestionnaire and postquestionnaire to determine a change in knowledge. The mean pretest scores were 67%, and the mean post-questionnaire score was 87%. This demonstrated a 29.9% change in participant's knowledge after the education sessions. A total of twenty-nine patients were admitted with perforated appendicitis during the project's time. Provider compliance with the treatment protocol using ceftriaxone and metronidazole was 100%. The result of this evidence-based project increased knowledge about perforated appendicitis, along with a high rate of compliance in following the updated treatment protocol for patients admitted with perforated appendicitis with no statistical increase in the length of stay.
