The stories are held together by George Willard, a resident to whom the community confide their personal stories and struggles. The townspeople are withdrawn and

The work has received high critical acclaim and is considered one of the great American works of the 20th century. Illustrated throughout with over 70 of Margaret Bourke-White's fine photographs, this is the great life story of a great American, greatly yet modestly told.
