Secondly this volume initiates the reader to the wonders and workings of language and points out how language is often misused, especially in regard to

the Bible. This volume, however, in no way anticipates all the ways of mishandling language. Silva's emphasis is on 'global' rather than detailed concerns (though selected specific examples are used) of how language is misused.
