The Impact of Social and Emotional Learning for Preschool Students in Special Education Early Intervention Rowman & Littlefield

This qualitative research study examined the perceptions of preschool Early Intervention special education teachers

about the impacts of social and emotional development on academic and functional success for 3 to 5 year old children with disabilities. In addition, the study identified social and emotional instructional practices used by those teachers to promote academic and functional success for 3-5 year old children with disabilities. The research was conducted with 62 preschool Early Intervention teachers from four Intermediate Units in Southeastern Pennsylvania. Nine of those teachers also volunteered to participate in a one on one interview with the researcher. A researcher developed online survey and interview questions were used to collect data for the study. The results of the study indicated that most of the teachers believed that their students' social and emotional development is essential for both functional and academic success. Almost all of the teachers thought that it was important to use specific instructional strategies to teach social and emotional learning (SEL). Some of the preschool Early Intervention teachers were very invested in implementing SEL curriculum and using specific strategies to teach SEL;

however only about half of the teachers were using an SEL Curriculum and just two-thirds were using specific instructional strategies to teach SEL.

There was observable improvement in their students' ability to identify their emotions, communicate their needs appropriately, self-regulate, and increased attention levels in class. The findings from this research study may contribute to school site decisions of the implementation and adoption of specific Social Emotional Curricula and may influence future teacher practices of embedding Social Emotional Learning in their lessons in order to minimize the inequality gaps of academics and socialization skills of Students with Special Needs.

Students with learning disabilities who spend the majority of the school day in a general education classroom often struggle to appropriately deal with feelings of frustration and anxiety. There is currently a gap in understanding how special education teachers can support the social and emotional inclusion of students with learning disabilities when they are in the general education classroom. The purpose of this study is to explore the results of implementing a social-emotional curriculum both in a pullout setting and in the general education setting and examine the effect of the program on the behavior of students with learning disabilities in the

general education classroom. This research expands on the ongoing dialog in the literature concerning the effects of explicit and targeted social-emotional instruction. Students with disabilities were included in the data collection in order to better understand how students perceive the effects of the curriculum. This is a qualitative study that consisted of interviews with ten students who qualify for special education services under the eligibility of Specific Learning Disability. Three teachers with participating students were also interviewed. Data showed that a social-emotional instructional program positively impacts both students with learning disabilities and the classroom as a whole by helping students increase their coping skills, which thereby helps reduce the instances of these students being upset at school and minimizes their reaction to academic and social struggles.
