Following Caravaggio's death in 1610, the French artist Valentin de Boulogne (1591-1632) emerged as one of the great champions of naturalistic painting. The eminent art historian Roberto Longhi honored him as "the most energetic and passionate of Caravaggio's naturalist followers." In Rome, Valentin—who loved the tavern as much as the painter's palette—fell in with a rowdy confederation of artists but eventually received commissions from some of the city's most prominent patrons. The direct costs to Medicare and Medicaid for care of people with Alzheimer's disease amount to more than \$148 billion annually (from Alzheimer's Association, 2008 Alzheimer's Disease Facts and Figures).
