"You mean, you saw people running around with guns and shooting each other?" "Yes, all the time." "Cool." I smile a little. "You should tell us about it sometime." "Yes, sometime." This is how

wars are fought now: by children, hopped-up on drugs and wielding AK-47s. Children have become soldiers of choice.
