When the original Thai version of Letters from Thailand appeared in Bangkok in 1969, it was promptly awarded the

Letters from Thailand Silkworm Books Jun'ichirō Tanizaki is one of the most eminent Japanese writers of the twentieth century, renowned for his investigations of family dynamics, eroticism, and cultural identity. Most acclaimed for his postwar novels such as *The Makioka Sisters* and *The Key*, Tanizaki made his literary debut in 1910.
