The introduction to the 1st International Conference on Computers for Handicapped Persons (Vienna, 1989) by A. MinTjoa (University of Vienna) and Roland Wagner (University of Linz) finished with the following mission statement on the "Future Direction on Computers for Handicapped Persons": "The different themes show that a lot of problems are solved by the usage of computer technology for helping handicapped persons, for instance for the blind and

visually handicapped. A consequence of the discussed themes there are two directions which should be done in the next years. One direction is obvious. The tools must be improved and research and development work should be extended to all groups of handicapped (even if they are numerically not so large as for instance the blind or visually handicapped persons). On the other side in the area of social implications there is an increasing demand on social science

studies on overall computer use among disabled persons. Because sources are in principle missing today about disabled persons work tasks, research in this field must begin by trying to survey this aspect. Particular attention should be paid to the extent and character of computer use among the handicapped in work life. There are a lot of questions, which should be answered during the next years for reaching the aim of rehabilitation. " Fifteen years later the 9th

International Conference on Computers Helping People with Special Needs (Paris, 2004) offered a comprehensive and deepened view on general awareness, special research and individual applications concerning disabled people and their participation in our society.
