Transforming Mental Health Services: Implementing the Federal Agenda for</p>	<p>Change consists of updates of papers written by the Commission's subcommittees addressing issues fundamental to those living with mental illness. It is organized into four sections: The first focuses on the interface between mental health and general health, and on employment, housing, and Medicaid financing. The second continues addressing financing and Medicaid as well as issues</p>
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related to school mental health, recovery, transformation of data systems, and acceleration of research. The third includes reports from four states with transformation initiatives designed to ensure that consumers have a strong voice in the development of recovery-oriented services. The specific capacities addressed include driving, financial and healthcare

decision-making, testamentary (i.e., will-making) capacity, and personal care and independence.
