### **Statehood Day**

Algonquin Young Readers Congressman John Lewis (GA-5) is an American icon, one of the key figures of the civil rights movement. His commitment to justice and nonviolence has taken him from an Alabama sharecropper's farm to the halls of Congress, from a segregated schoolroom to the 1963 March on

Washington, and from receiving beatings from state troopers to receiving the Medal of Freedom from the first African-American president. In the early nineteenth century individual liberty was conceded to the male part of society only; women were still held under the law as goods and chattels, and were voiceless, publicly, except as they influenced husband, sweetheart or

son. In the United States of America a band of women organized themselves into an anti-slavery society in 1837. The ridicule and Opprobrium heaped upon. These women is scarcely believable today. This society sent two women delegates to a world anti slavery convention held in London in the early part of the last century. They were refused their seats in the convention, not because they could not qualify as duly appointed delegates, but because they were females! That

act gave stimulus to the agitation which culminated in the formation Of the American Woman's Suffrage Association at Seneca Falls, New York, in 1848. These valiant women had to fight against heavy Odds of ridicule and disgrace every step of the way upward to full self-expression.
